We must move through those days to arrive at the fresh beauty of spring. For Christians, the Lenten journey we are upon may hold that same mental struggle of traversing through the darkness to arrive at the light-filled joy of Easter morning.

In recognizing that Lent is the time to let the power of our faith story to take hold of us, Ann Weems writes also of the fear with which some of us struggle in taking the time to thinking honestly about our faith story. For, as she points out, when we do the necessary self-reflecting we also encounter fears of facing our future knowing fully the truth about our past.

No matter how many years we have moved through the days of Lent, most of us still carry these emotions in varying degrees. During this Lenten journey we will encounter Christian truths that make us uneasy...deepen our awareness...bring cheers to our lips...and overwhelming sorrow to our hearts. Let us remain open to the change God seeks to initiate within us and allow ourselves to be fed and move into the deeper understanding we seek.

Lent can be a time of profound transformation. It's not all about penance and punishment. It's about recognizing who you are on Ash Wednesday and discovering a deeper understanding of whose you are on Easter morning. It's about the God-journey that will stir you up and bring change to your life. It's about being open to the movement of Lent. Movement that moves you closer to who God is calling you to be. Lent is a time of discovery...a time of deep breathing...a time of participating a bit more fully as a faith-filled child of God.

## Pill Bottle Donations

On most any day if you walk into the 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue connector entrance you'll find a bag or two of empty pill bottles. Why? Because collecting these bottles from the community is one of the mission programs of Faith United Church of Christ.

Matthew 25: Ministries of Cincinnati, Ohio, accepts donations of empty plastic pill bottles for improving medical care in developing countries. The bottles provide a way for physicians to distribute medication in a safe and clean manner. To be dispersed, before shipping the bottles must

- -- Have an all plastic lid.
- -- Have all labels removed with no remaining glue or residue
- -- Be washed in very hot water and dish soap
- -- Be rinsed and dried thoroughly
- -- Have clean, dry lids placed on clean, dried bottles

While we have a volunteer who has been washing all bottles, if we could reduce the number of bottles she washes each month that would be grand. If you are able to wash them before dropping them off, please either put them in a large zip-lock bag, a plastic shopping bag, or a box with a note that indicates they have been washed.

If you would like to support this mission but do not use plastic pill bottles, monetary gifts to defray the cost of shipping the bottles are always welcome! Make your check out to Faith UCC, note "shipping" in the memo and drop off at the church or mail to PO Box 14, Tripoli, 50676.
