When we experience it, how often do we notice it? Those birds and rabbits (and eventually squirrels) weren't aware of their kindhearted togetherness, but shouldn't we be? With all of the chaos in our country and our world, shouldn't we take notice of the non-violent, non-arguing, non-defiant, non-bullying times and celebrate them? To take the time to reflect upon how good it feels to get along with others? Or to listen to the opinions of others with an open mind? To offer respect to others no matter who they are or where they are on life's journey?

Granted, like in the animal kingdom there are going to be times when tension rise...traditions clash...and unkind words are volleyed back and forth. Or worse. Samantha Schmidt, daughter of Steve Schmidt, granddaughter of Dolores Schmidt. and niece of Barb & Steve Hill, graduated in May from Central Lyon High School in Rock Rapids, Iowa. Sammy was one of five students to travel to Johnson Space Center in Houston, Texas, to complete in the regional NASA Space Settlement Design Competition. Four teams of 60 students each had to develop a proposal to design a space settlement for 12,500 residents. Proposals needed to address human needs such as housing, education, automation, waste management, exercise and entertainment for the space settlement which would permanently orbit the moon. Each team was led by a NASA space industry volunteer as CEO of the team. The CEO's then recommended students for the International Competition to be held at Kennedy Space Center in Florida in July. Sammy was one of 10 students chosen to attend this competition with students from Great Britain, China, India, Malaysia, Australia and South America. Congratulations, Sammy!

## OUTREACH

The **WOMEN OF FAITH** bring to the church the monthly opportunity to support **HIS HANDS FOOD PANTRY** in Oran through monthly donations of food and household items. For the month of June, the food pantry has requested donations of

### Helping Hands Clothing Closet

Helping Hands served 118 client in the month of April. Volunteers served 43 hours to help clients with clothing needs.

### Mobile Food Pantry

On the 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday of each month, Faith UCC hosts the Tripoli area Mobile Food Pantry (MFP). Each month food insecure households are assisted by what they receive as they walk past the tables set up in our Ed Wing lobby.

The May MFP will be on **Thursday, June 28<sup>th</sup>**. Distribution is from 5 pm to 6 pm. Set up is from 4 pm to 5 pm.

### Pill Bottle Donations

On most any day if you walk into the 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue connector entrance you'll find a bag or two of empty pill bottles. Why? Easy answer – collecting these bottles from the community is one of the mission programs of Faith United Church of Christ.

Matthew 25: Ministries of Cincinnati, Ohio, accepts donations of empty plastic pill bottles for improving medical care in developing countries. The bottles provide a way for physicians to distribute medication in a safe and clean manner. To be dispersed, before shipping the bottles must

- Have an all plastic lid.
- Have all labels removed with no remaining glue or residue
- Be washed in very hot water and dish soap
- Be rinsed and dried thoroughly
- Have clean, dry lids placed on clean, dried bottles

There is a box in the entryway where you can place your bags of washed bottle. If you are not able to wash the bottles you donate, please bag them up and place them in the “not washed” box in the connector.

If you would like to support this mission but do not use plastic pill bottles, monetary gifts to defray the cost of shipping the bottles are always welcome! Make your check out to Faith UCC, note “shipping” in the memo and drop off at the church or mail to PO Box 14, Tripoli, 50676.

### Best Choice “Save-A-Label”

Did you know that saving Best Choice labels can make money for the church? Best Choice products (available at Casey's in Tripoli; J & C Grocery in Sumner; Brother's Market in Denver; Fredericksburg Food Center; and other area markets) will donate three cents for every Best Choice UPC label redeemed (a minimum of 1,000 per calendar year required). So, if we collected 1,000 we would receive \$30. Two thousand labels – \$60. A win/win, right? We're starting a bit late for this year but who knows – we might gather 1,000 by the end of the year! We don't need to have the entire label, just the UPC symbol with Best Choice printed above it. Look throughout the building for places to drop off your Best Choice UPC labels.
