There is a Facebook meme* that has been going around the past month or so...

In a culture that celebrates a new year and makes January 1 resolutions that often do not last to February 1, many of us are approaching 2021 with a rather hesitant walk. A new year which might once been leaped into envisioning exciting changes and goals achieved and hope born again, now may be approached with a huge slice of apprehension.

Let's be real. The clock ticking from 11:59 pm on December 31 to 12:00 am on January 1, is not going to suddenly make everything better. That only happens in a Hallmark movie. But for many of us, the new year does symbolically provide a clean slate upon which to write our story. Yet this year, I find myself reflecting upon the importance of not beginning over but rather continuing on. Yes there are many troubling aspects of 2020 that I think we can agree we don't want to be experiencing throughout all of 2021, but I believe there are some things we must take with us into this next trip around the sun.

While we have lamented the loss of public and private gatherings...hugs and high-fives...worship as we grew up expecting it to be...shopping and dining out and cheering on our favorite team in person to name a few, think about what many of us <u>have</u> been able to do.

Through technology and creativity and patience (learning something new isn't always the easiest, is it?), many of us have been able to connect visually and verbally to important people in our lives. We have celebrated birthdays and recitals and holidays in a new, socially-distanced way.

We've come to appreciate more fully the doctors and nurses who work hard each year but who have been under overwhelmingly great pressure during these pandemic times. We have prayed for them. And in our prayers we have included the myriad of background workers – the kitchen staff and housekeeping and custodians and many others who have kept the hospitals going. Folks we might not have been as aware of in the past.

We've redefined the phrase "essential" workers. Recognizing it not only includes local police and emergency management and firefighters and ambulance crews, but it also includes the retail workers, postal workers, restaurant staff, and countless others who kept businesses and services available despite the risk to their own health.

We thank God for the teachers! The teachers, staff, and administration of not only our Tripoli schools but all places of learning who have found creative and sound ways to continue to do what they love best – teaching our children. No easy task, but they did not surrender. And, of course, big kudos to the parents who suddenly found themselves in the role of substitute teachers. Brought a whole new level of respect for teachers, right?

And, of course, we have found new ways to be the church. New ways to worship. New ways to meet. And learn. And give. It has not always been smooth, but to date we have hurdled the bumps and will undoubtedly do the same for those that pop up in the future.

For me personally, I have developed an even closer bond with God. Not only in thinking how to do church and be church with all of you, but in my own personal relationship. I cannot tell you how many times I have felt God's love wrapping me up, reassuring me and guiding me to "a still more excellent way." I hope that in the midst of the COVID chaos, you too have heard God's still-speaking calming voice.

My friends, as we move into 2021, I believe it is so important that we carry with us these new understandings...these adjustments to the way it's always been...the "gosh, I never thought of doing it THAT way!" realizations. Sometimes we get so focused on the way things have been that we fail to clear our eyes to what might be. If we learn from these past months...if our relationship with God is more developed, more trusting, more listening...if we feel a deeper appreciation of the importance of family and friends...if we can place value on those hardworking everyday folks we have perhaps previously looked past...then our loneliness and our tears have not been pointless.

As of this writing, nearly 2 million people worldwide have died. The tragedy that has encircled this globe is unprecedented in our lifetimes. Let them not have died in vain. Let us honor them, doing everything we are able to do to make this world a better place for <u>all</u> of God's children. Let us walk into 2021 with 2020 still tucked into our back pocket as a constant reminder of where we have been and where we are going with our lives.

In the coming months when life as we know it begins to look and feel a bit more like what we've grown accustomed to in our lifetimes, let us each pause and reflect upon all that 2020 held for us. All the frustrations and anger and joys and sorrows. We simply cannot pack 2020 away and act as if it did not exist. It is our reality. And it will shape our new reality in the coming months. But by learning from it and being better people because of what we have learned, we will be that much closer to helping to maintain the world our benevolent God first visualized, created, and called "good."
