After 9-1/2 years of helping food-insecure residents of Tripoli and surrounding communities, the final **Tripoli Mobile Food Pantry** will be Thursday, October 21, at 5:00 pm. While during the past 9-1/2 years we have distributed food to as many as 50 households a month, our client numbers have been steadily declining this year. It is simply no longer a good use of the limited funds of the Northeast Iowa Food Bank (NEIFB) to continue to pack/load/and distribute the food to us for such a small number. I personally want to thank all of the volunteers who have participated through the years and the many clients with whom we have interacted. It truly has been a joy to work beside you and serve you. I also add a big thank you to Rich Milius who was president of the church when the NEIFB first contacted Faith UCC. Rich was immediately supportive of the idea and continued to advocate for the Mobile Pantry not only with his presence but also his wisdom as we journeyed through the many changes that came our way during those 9-1/2 years.
