We pray for the families and communities where lives and sense of safety have been shattered by war, violence, flooding, fires, earthquakes, heat, drought, and fear. "Take care! Protect yourself against the least bit of greed. Life is not defined by what you have, even when you have a lot."

How much money is too much money? In the parable referenced above — frequently referred to as "The Parable of the Rich Fool" — Jesus is talking with a man in the gathered crowd. The fellow wants to know how to handle his brother who refuses to divide the family inheritance with him. (We can assume he is referring to an older brother since Judaic inheritance practices called for an older brother to receive two-thirds of an estate, the other third going to the younger.) In response, Jesus offers the above words of wisdom as only Jesus can.

On the surface, I get what Jesus is saying. Greed causes people to never be satisfied they have enough...to live their life hoarding as much as they can...and believing that their needs/wants/hopes hold more importance than those of others. But digging a bit deeper I have to wonder – if you recognize the importance of giving, how you know when you've given enough? Do you ever give enough? Can you ever give enough to a charity...a non-profit organization you believe in...your place of worship...your community...your family?

In May of this year I read an article about a \$122.6 million contribution MacKenzie Scott made to the Big Brothers Big Sisters of America organization. If you're not familiar with Scott, she helped to build Amazon with her ex-husband and has an estimated net worth of \$48.3 billion. (I know...I can't begin to wrap my head around that much money either.) It's estimated that Scott has given away more than \$12 billion to nearly 1,200 groups, focusing on "the needs of underrepresented people from groups of all kinds."

I celebrate Scott's generosity in using her wealth to make a difference in the lives of others, but at the same time I have to wonder – how does she know how much to give...who to give it to...and when to stop. Take that \$122.6 million she gave to Big Brothers Big Sisters. How did she arrive at that figure? Why not a round \$123 million. Or, since we're a country that celebrates much in increments of five, why not make it \$125 million? How does she know when she's given enough?

How do you?

No, this is not a stewardship article. It's meant to be a thought-provoking article. How do you know when you've given enough? How do you know when you've given enough of your time/talents/treasures to the church and other organizations you support? Or your family...friends...neighbors. Granted you may not have the perceived unlimited funds of MacKenzie Scott, but most of us do have enough to give something and often more than we might think. So again, how do you know?

I tithe to the church and have for many years. Personally, that was an important level for me to attain. But I wonder, might achieving that 10% level have been possible sooner if I had only shifted some priorities? Made some different decisions? Maybe. And even now I wonder...is it enough?

How much do you think is enough?

The meeting was called to order by Conrad Marsh.

<u>Approval of the minutes</u>: Motion by Kathy Westendorf to approve the minutes of the June 6, 2022, council meeting, seconded by Beth Goudschaal, motion carried. Motion to approve the June 5, 2022, Special Council Meeting with adding Jerry Lahmann in attendance made by Kara Marsh, seconded by Eli Bahrenfuse, motion carried.
