Lent. What memories and images come to mind when you hear the word Lent? For many who grew up in a Christian family, the familiar phrase surrounding Lent is, "What are you giving up for Lent?" The responses can range from a favorite food, caffeine, sweets, shopping, watching tv, arguing – the list of options is long. Some people commit to adding a new positive to their day – community service, re-connecting with friends, calling distant loved one more frequently. Others use the 40 days of Lent to strengthen their spirituality.

In the midst of all that is/has been/will be creating tension and worry and sadness in our current lives, moving deeper into our awareness of God's love and truth will not only strengthen our faith but also help us know how better to respond to people and situations in a new and benevolent way. During Lent, how might committing to setting aside time each day for prayer and contemplation reshape your faith journey?

I recently read a blog from the Institute for Communal Contemplation and Dialogue titled, "Time to Renew Your Contemplative Journey this Lent." The following is an excerpt...

Contemplation helps us to "see" in new ways, inviting us to respond out of love and not fear...The Gospels tell us that Jesus often prayed: intensely for 40 days, alone after giving of himself serving people's needs and exercising his power, and communally at meals....his prayer went beyond words, beyond thinking. Jesus rested in Divine Love but not a resting of inaction. Rather, that resting freed him from current ways of thinking and opened a spaciousness within him so that he could "see" in new ways. Jesus' heart became his organ of perception responding from the indwelling of Divine Love to be in service to all.

The magnetic center of Divine Love dwells within each of us — drawing us, inviting us to make the space for us to "see" in new ways and to respond from that love.

On Wednesday, February 22, we will gather in the sanctuary to begin our Lenten journey. On Sunday, April 9, we will gather to celebrate the risen Christ. Please join me in praying for church members and friends that during these days of Lent we might all encounter our still-speaking God...feel the presence of the Son in new and unexpected ways...be filled with the Holy Spirit...and together raise up our alleluias on Easter morning with deeper insight and understanding.

The meeting was called to order by President Conrad Marsh.

<u>Approval of the 2022 Annual Meeting:</u> Motion to approve the minutes of the January 16, 2022 meeting made by Larry Struck, seconded by Beth Goudschaal, the motion was carried.

<u>Approval of the June Congregational Meeting:</u> Motion to approve the minutes of the June 5, 2022 meeting was made by Kathy Westendorf, seconded by Jerry Snelling, the motion was carried.

<u>President's Report:</u> Conrad reflected on some of the highlights of his report. Thanking many for their help in various ways throughout the year. Conrad also mentioned the return of Adult Education and the Adult Choir. He also mentioned that the decisions that were made by the council weren't always easy but made with the best interest of Faith Church in mind.

<u>Property Committee Report:</u> Eli Bahrenfuse, Liaison for the Property Committee spoke on behalf of the Property Committee. Eli noted that a couple big projects have been completed with future plans of landscaping around the church and the parsonage and the painting of the louvers on the steeple and painting around the windows on the parsonage. Eli also touched on a 3-year plan of looking at the furnaces in the church as the heat chamber in one of them is nearing its end. There were no questions.

Events Committee Report: Kathy Westendorf expressed the need for help with this committee going forward. One of the many things that she spoke about was the Easter Sunrise Breakfast and needing help to make that happen. She also spoke about exploring different ways to bring growth to Faith Church. There were no questions.

<u>Sunday School Report:</u> Kara Marsh reported there is a small group for the Middle School students who are actively participating during the worship service. She also touched on the event with Grace Church and the hopes of doing an event together in the future. Traci Bahrenfuse reported that she helps with the younger students and what a normal Sunday morning looks like. There were no questions.

Memorial Endowment Report: Phyllis Schnurstein thanked the members of the committee for all their hard work during the year. Phyllis also thanked the members of the families of Marty Smalley, Virgil Ducker, Betty Schwartz and Glenyce Bolte for their memorial donations. She spoke about the landscaping project around the church and the parsonage coming up this year in the spring. Phyllis thanked the committee members. There were no questions.

<u>Cemetery Report:</u> Roger Goudschaal gave a financial breakdown of how the year has been going. Roger explained that in previous years the money made from the investments have paid for the expenses, however this last year was not that case. There were no questions.

Women of Faith Report: Karen Milius spoke on behalf of the committee. She spoke about the various events they were involved with this past year and how the money was donated to various projects within the church. They are still not able to do BINGO at the Tripoli Nursing Home. Karen thanked all the Women of Faith for their hard work during the year.

<u>Faith United Church of Christ Giving Report:</u> As Financial Secretary, Roger Goudschaal spoke about the report. Roger thanked all who gave during 2022. He reiterated what Conrad had mentioned about having to borrow for operating expenses and paying back the tuckpointing project. Roger went into some detail explaining the report. A question was asked if those who are giving zero are contacted. Some of those who give zero are students or in a position where they are not able to donate. Don Bunce asked about the loose offering and if that was being designated to any person, Roger explained that if money is not designated by someone, he cannot give credit to anyone for that money.

## 2023 Faith United Church of Christ Budget:

Prior to the discussion on the 2023 Budget, some of the Council members were uncertain if all of the figures included the final Council updates. In an effort to ensure complete accuracy, the decision was made to postpone the discussion and congregational approval of the budget until the financial pages could be verified.

#### Old Business: None.

New Business: Marlene Snelling felt the pay for the Inside Custodian should be raised to \$4,500 per year. This will be looked at during the February 6 Council Meeting. There will be another Congregational Meeting on Sunday, February 5, 2023 to approve the 2023 Faith United Church of Christ Budget. Some discussion on ways to lower some costs at Faith. Conrad explained that the budget had been looked at numerous times with some line items being lowered to almost nothing, but the cost of some utilities has gone up which will be reflected in the budget.

Nomination for Trustee, Dean Shinstine and Dave Kirchhoff. Financial Secretary, Roger Goudschaal. Treasurer, Barb Hill. A motion by Don Bunce to approve the nominations as stated, seconded by Tamara Rosol. Conrad asked that all who were in favor of the nominations respond by saying "Aye," the nominations were carried.
