We continue to pray for the families and communities where lives and sense of safety have been shattered. "Hear, O Israel:

The LORD is our God, the LORD alone.

You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might.

Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart.

Recite them to your children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise.

Bind them as a sign on your hand, fix them as an emblem on your forehead, and write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.

— Deuteronomy 6:4-9

The above passage is part of the Shemah prayer that has been recited by many traditional practicing Jews since the second century. Often the Shemah is written upon a parchment scroll, placed in a mezuzah (a small, decorative box) and affixed on the doorpost of the entrance to a Jewish home. Of the mezuzah, Rabbi Joseph Telushkin writes, "When a Jew enters his house, he sees the mezuzah and is thereby reminded how he should act in his home. Likewise, when a Jew leaves the house, the mezuzah reminds him of the high level of behavior he is expected to maintain wherever he goes."

Do you allow your behavior in and away from your home to be guided by your faith? Is your daily interaction and behavior with family and friends and strangers affected by your belief in God? What might you use to quietly remind yourself of who you are and whose you are and use that knowledge to transform your life? Maybe it's a scroll or a sign on your door...maybe it's a paperclip in your pocket...maybe it's a cross on a chain around your neck...maybe it's a common word that when you hear it helps you to better focus on what it means to believe in the One who created us all.

I invite you to take some time to discover your own daily personal form of a reminder. When you touch it or hold it or look upon it, remember these words (and perhaps even speak them out loud) from Deuteronomy...

You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might.

Think about it...pray about it...listen for God's still-speaking voice guiding you. Open your heart and your mind to all that awaits you as a beloved child of God!

Meeting called to order by Jerry Lahmann

Opening Prayer: Pastor Marilyn.

Approval of the August 7th Minutes: Motion to approve by Dave Kirchhoff. Seconded by Beth Goudschaal.

<u>Treasurer Report:</u> Motion to approve by Beth Goudschaal. Seconded by Brenda Shinstine Women of Faith donating \$2,000 to the furnace/AC fund.

<u>Trustee Report</u>: Fridge in Fellowship Hall needs attention. Eli called Gulbronson's Appliance out of Cedar Falls; they specialize in commercial equipment. Waiting for a call back.

Solar system: Still working with Elsamiller Electric on an audit, we are also looking into grants available. We would receive a 30% tax credit if it is installed by 2032. The panels would have to be installed by the meter. Alliant offers a 70% coverage of project total cost, with an audit. Working to confirm we qualify.

Looking into replacing the water heaters to Flash heaters (on-demand heat), would save money on electric.

<u>Elder Report:</u> Women of Faith is hosting a basket raffle on October 29, 2023. The event will be called Faith Fund for Furnace Fund, lunch will also be served.

First day of Sunday School 9/10, with breakfast served for the kids.

Neighbors in Need will be discussed during September 17th service.

Candles and holders donated in honor of Logan Liddle.

Elders working on reviewing and updating the bylaws.

<u>Summer Day Camp</u>: Went well for the first year, many lessons learned to help improve next year. Working to update rules for parent drop offs, to confirm hours needed for staffing and to improve payroll. Profit was \$671.00 for the first year. Great feedback from the parents and everyone is looking forward to an even more successful year next year.

Special thanks to everyone that donated toys, food, money, air conditioner, their time, and talents. It was greatly appreciated and helped make their first year a success.

<u>Memorial Committee:</u> Motion to change the memorial endowment financial representative from Phyllis Schnurstein to Marlene Snelling by Dave Kirchhoff. Seconded by Eli Bahrenfuse. Motion approved.

Currently have endowment CD of \$47,917.72, will reinvest \$47,900, we need \$50,000 to be able to draw residual income. \$2,100 is needed by September 14th. Current rates are 4.45% interest on 7 months or 4.65% interest on 21 months. The committee is looking to find out if rates can be improved.

Memorial CD due September 4th is currently at \$8,612.13. Memorial Savings is \$3,454.08, total funds \$12,066.21.

The memorial committee received a bid for the landscaping, \$750 for material and Eli to donate labor. They approved to proceed with this bid. Landscaping to be completed soon.

The memorial committee has requested a visible sheet of funds coming in and going out of the memorial fund.

The memorial committee is updating and reviewing their policies, will be completed by the end of the year for council approval.

The memorial committee members donated \$156 to print and send the endowment/memorial brochures to the congregation.

Liaison Report: None.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Working with Wartburg on their choir singing during service this winter, more details to come. Looking into licensing for movie nights held at the church, once a month.

Old Business: Nothing.

<u>New Business:</u> Received a bill from the city for tree trimming that wasn't completed in time. Property Committee to run through all properties and confirm priorities. They will work to receive estimates if needed for any issues they may find.

Bonnie Travers will be leading a time for teen talk before church for youth that have been confirmed, to continue growing their faith.

Motion to adjourn by Kara Marsh. Seconded by Beth Goudschaal.

The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

#### Prayer Shawl Ministry


