Whether reading of God's words spoken directly from the prophet Joel or reading Peter quoting Joel quoting God on the Day of Pentecost when folks were amazed...perplexed...or accusing others of being drunk at 9 o'clock in the morning, I've always found power in those words, "Your young shall see visions...your old shall dream dreams."

I remember being young and looking around and envisioning things as I wished they could be. I grew up in a congregation that was very active in social justice. I long held onto those visions but I must admit in the past couple of decades I've felt my vision disappearing like a wispy cloud on a breezy day.

It reminds me of what the apostle Paul wrote — "When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways." (1 Corinthians 13:11) Were my visions childlike? Was I too young to see things as they really were? As an adult, did I need to abandon my "childish ways" of believing things could and would turn around?

Maybe it's in aging...maybe it is in our adulting that Joel and Peter picture us as beginning our dreaming. As our years dwindle down, perhaps they become not visions for our lifetime but rather dreams for our descendants. Dreams for our children and our grandchildren and our great-grandchildren and all of the children of the world.

During a recent worship service at Urbandale UCC, my mom spoke to the children of the church. She shared what she had learned from her ancestors and what she hoped to pass on to her descendants. She spoke eloquently and from the heart as the young ones who were gathered around her listened and asked questions. Undoubtedly some will long recall her words as they form their own visions...and someday those visions will be shifted into dreams for their own descendants. Because isn't that what we do as faithful children of God? Share and hope and have visions and dreams.

I cannot envision standing on the brink of turning 100 as my mother is doing but no matter at what age my journey ends, I will still have dreams for those to follow. Dreams of kindness and consideration... dreams of equality for all...dreams of adequate food and water for all of God's children...dreams of an end to multiple-casualty shootings and the horrors of war...dreams of wealth equity.

Meeting called to order by Jerry Lahmann

Opening Prayer: Pastor Marilyn..

<u>Approval of the September 5th Minutes</u>: Motion to approve by Beth Goudschaal. Seconded by Kathy Westendorf

Treasurer Report: Motion to approve by Eli Bahrenfuse. Seconded by Beth Goudschaal.

<u>Trustee Report</u>: Eli has contacted three different companies in regard to the fellowship refrigerator, with no response. Jerry and Conrad to get more contacts for him to reach out to. Eli also looking into the requirements for servicing on the elevator and if a contract is needed with the company that manufactured the elevator or if a contact at Schumacher Elevator can complete those inspections. The annual contract with the manufacturer is \$425/yearly. If repairs/services are needed on the elevator and we are not in contract with the manufacturing company, it is \$180/hr plus travel fees of \$180/hr and an additional \$.60 a mile. Eli is working to get clarification.

<u>Elder Report:</u> The Elders are reviewing the by-laws to see if any changes or updates are needed. The Elders are also confirming if the by-laws are being performed/completed as stated. The Elders are also working to confirm which committees are still active and meeting and which are not. Confirm if any need to be removed from the by -laws or more engagement is needed from the congregation.

<u>Liaison Report:</u> The Memorial Committee was able to reach the \$50,000 needed for the best interest payout for the endowment.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> When Pastor is out on vacation, we have a budget to compensate her coverage, currently we have not been paying this out. Motion to approve \$50/per Sunday coverage by Kathy Westendorf. Seconded by Bonnie Travers. Pastor will be out November 5th- November 14th. October 29th is All Saints Sunday.

Old Business: Discussion on custodial wage increase. The custodian is working 7-8hrs weekly and also takes rags home to wash. Motion to increase custodial wages to \$400/monthly by Bonnie Travers. Seconded by Beth Goudschaal

There are funds in an Easter/advent gifts budget that wasn't been used, looking into maybe using this towards the furnace fund.

New Business: Nothing.

Motion to adjourn by Beth Goudschaal.. Seconded by Eli Bahrenfuse. The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.
