

Lenten Study Opportunity

During Lent this year, we will be reading "The Way" by Adam Hamilton. We will begin on Wednesday evening March 12th. The books have been ordered. Please contact the Faith UCC office if you would like a copy. We will also be sharing and discussing a DVD that accompanies this book study. Bonnie Travers will be facilitating this discussion.

We will gather in the Faith Church Fellowship Hall at 5:30 for a Lenten evening meal. We will then remain in Fellowship Hall to begin the book discussion at 6:30.

Join us as we travel with Adam Hamilton as he retraces the life and ministry of Jesus Christ. Once again Hamilton approaches his subject matter with thoughtfulness and wisdom. Using historical information, chronological data, and stories of the faith, Hamilton follows in the footsteps of Jesus from his baptism, to being tempted, including the people he loved, the parables he taught, the enemies he made, and the healing he brought. We will enter Jerusalem, where Jesus was arrested and crucified, then continue this journey with Jesus through his death and resurrection! Please join us for this 6 week Lenten study.

"The Way"

According to John Mark Comer, author of "Practicing the Way," the original name for the followers of Jesus was "The Way" or "the followers of The Way." Commer cites Saul in Acts Chapter 9: Saul was speaking in the synagogue in Damascus, saying "are any of you following the way?" The Greek word for way is hodos, which literally means a road or path.

Comer goes on to say that the way of Jesus is not just ideas we believe to be true, but more a way of life! Christianity is more than a theory about the universe, more than teaching written down on paper, rather, it is a path along which we journey, in the deepest and richest sense, it is the way of life!

So often in the church much is said about what to believe, what is right or wrong, but little is said about a lifestyle that reflects a relationship with God. Are you in a right relationship with God? Is your heart humble and soft so God can use you? Softer hearts prevail as we ask God for wisdom in troubling times.

Life is hard, and especially now that our church is going through transition and changes. Change is hard and challenging. We sometimes feel with change we are losing a piece of ourselves. Let's face it, loss is hard. How do we navigate change without feeling threatened or lost? We ask God to give us understanding hearts. We are going to all make mistakes as we try to make our way on this new journey of trying to fill pastor Marliyn's shoes.

If we humble ourselves and give one another grace, and if we ask God to give us wisdom and patience, we can navigate this new path. As we journey together ask yourself how can God use me? Allow Him to transform you for work in his kingdom now and forever. Ask yourself, are you following the way? Jesus said, I am the way and the truth and life. This is a way of life modeled after Jesus himself that is far beyond anything this world can offer. It can open you up to God's presence and power. However it requires you to follow a path marked out for you by Jesus himself. How do we find the right path?

Jesus said enter through the narrow gate, for wide is the gate that leads to destruction, for many will enter it. But small is the gate and narrow is the road that leads to life, and only a few find it. The way of Jesus is narrow, meaning it is a very specific way to live. If you follow it, it will lead you to a life pleasing to God, and the assurance of eternal life in His kingdom. Live your life now and forever in union with Jesus Christ our Lord and our Savior.

How do we ensure that our words and actions are pleasing to God? Do our words and actions match? If not, how can God use our earthly circumstances to change our hearts? How can we prevail with softer hearts, forgiving one another. The Bible tells us to spend time studying his word. Communicate your desires in prayer, while listening for that small soft voice nudging you in a particular direction.

Does your thinking line up with Jesus' teachings? He gives us people who love God to help us discern the will of God., through conversations and ideas rooted in prayer from the congregation and direction of the conference. The council will need your patience, prayers and understanding as they travel "the way" that God has set before us. He has put us on a path as followers of the way! May we journey the path with grace and love from our Lord Jesus Christ with soft hearts, listening ears, and forgiving one another.

Lord, help us discern your will in the future of this congregation as we make A Way forward! Amen.

Opening Prayer by Kathy Westendorf

Meeting called to order by Dave Kirchhoff

<u>UCC Conference Chat:</u> Jeff Hagaman is an expert in the search and call committees. He is a retired Pastor and his previous church is still looking for a full time Pastor after almost two years.

Kendy Miller serves as an associate conference minster. Her job title is Generalist. She specializes in helping build the profile of the church and helping us really decern our needs and wants for a full-time Pastor. Urges us not to make any fast, easy decisions that we may regret later.

The UCC would like us to follow authorization and recommendations for the protection of our church, community and denomination. Two to three people from our congregation could be appointed for leading Communion and Baptisms, if they accept. They would need proper training that is lead by the Conference. Sacramental Servants are not a paid position, and a ten-hour training is required. Lay ministry standing or Licensed pastors, are hired to be bridge Pastors or until we find a full-time Pastor. If any interest Cory and Kendy would be able to walk with those to fulfil this calling.

Flow Chart shared by the Conference: Shows step by step what would be most beneficial for the Church and being successful in forming our search and call committee and finding our next full-time Pastor.

Lots of tools and resources available, one being discernment travel log. Might be a great first step in our path forward.

We should look at this as an opportunity, although a stressful time, we can build off the wants and needs of our congregation and keeping communication open in our path forward.

<u>Approval of the January 6th and January 21st Minutes:</u> Motion to approve by Kara Marsh. Seconded by Brenda Shinstine.

Treasurer Report: Current balance at bank - \$14,251.34 before Sunday's deposit.

Check written for Pastor's two week of vacation. Pastor requested the last two weeks be paid by mid-February. Council approved to pay this out. Motion to pay all four weeks, \$4,250.80 to Pastor by Jay Ranard. Seconded by Bonnie Travers.

Motion to approve the treasurer report by Dean Shinstine. Seconded by Conrad Marsh.

<u>Trustee Report</u>: Problems with moisture on the walls in the basement. Working to get ahold of contractors for quotes, no responses as of yet. In March the property committee will go to the parsonage to check in for what repairs are needed.

Flash water heater for the kitchen, waiting on a quote. May need improved electrical to run this water heater. Couple volunteers, Brian Bunce, Lynn Johnson and Sharon McLavey will help support any needs in the office. In case Barb Rich is out sick or any unforeseen issues come up. Boiler update: exhaust pump replaced not the issue. Wiring harness replaced and seemed to fix the issue. Checking with Ryan to see if we can return the exhaust pump.

Elder Report: Kathy will make the gluten free bread for Communion in March.

Marlene Snelling announced they will be doing the silent auction/meal on March 23rd.

Will it be possible to do Lenten meals this year? Hoping to have Council help taking turns, serving and cooking.

Sign up for fellowship and liturgists to be passed around church again, seemed to have more volunteers. Pulpit Supply: covered through April 17th and Easter Sunday covered. Working to continue to fill the remainder of the year.

Old Business: Constitution and bylaws have been reworked. The question is on the Committees, many are not being fulfilled. We may need to update the bylaws.

New Business:

Kara Marsh nominated Dave Kirchoff for President. Seconded by Vicki Oleson. Traci Bahrenfuse nominated Vicki Oleson for Vice President. Seconded by Jay Ranard. Vicki Oleson nominated Traci Bahrenfuse as Secretary and seconded by Mike Westendorf. Traci Bahrenfuse nominated Bonnie Travers for head Elder. Seconded by Vicki Oleson. Dave Kirchhoff nominated Mike Westendorf for head Trustee. Seconded by Jay Ranard. Working to setup a Retreat for the Council and Committees to review and update to align with the needs of our Church.

Dave Kirchhoff and Mike Westendorf as the President and head Trustee have access to checking and savings accounts and the safe deposit box and both the CD's.
